

The Royal Army Medical Service Update from the RHQ



Foreword by Brig Phil Carter, Head Army Healthcare / Head RAMS

Whilst most of the discussion has, perhaps inevitably, been about uniform, and I am pleased to report that uniform roll out is moving at pace with boxes of berets, TRFs, belts and rank insignia beginning to arrive in units, Project Victoria was actually about modernising our institution.

What we had was three under-resourced Corps HQs attempting to manage the vital 'People' aspect of the Army's medical capability and a slightly odd HQ Army Medical Services attempting to bring coherence but challenged by the fact that the Army, constitutionally, recognises Corps and Regiments, and the 'AMS', despite a long and glorious history together, was neither. This led to QARANC, RADC and RAMC personnel deploying together but being supported differently. Modern healthcare is defined by multidisciplinary teams and modern healthcare practice by the needs of the patient not the initial training of the clinician. Like many, I would like to see the benefits of Pj Victoria deliver faster. It is important to our ethos and espirit de corps that our people feel the benefit of being RAMS as soon as possible. But the timeline for the amalgamation was dictated to us, and the team have worked incredibly hard to prioritise the myriad of issues that arise when attempting something as significant as the formation of a new Corps.

With the coming together of the three Corps' activities under a single, properly constituted RHQ RAMS, enabling the Corps Colonel to optimise the way in which our people team in Camberley support the Army's operational effectiveness, and through a strengthening of the voice of serving personnel in how our Corps is run, we are now in a much better position to modernise our capability and face the operational challenges of tomorrow.

I look to all those with leadership roles and those with influence who care about the quality of medical support we provide to soldiers now and, in the future, to support our RHQ in ensuring that this amalgamation is a success, that it strengthens our multidisciplinary teams, and that all the benefits, not just the new TRF, are delivered.

Dress



Update from the Corps SM on the RAMS Dress Fielding Plan:

- The fielding plan is underway, however there has been a delay in the delivery of Soldiers accoutrements. This is having a knock on with issuing to organisations that are a priority (Deploying Units etc).
- As soon as kit (Beret / TRF / Stable Belt / Rank Slides) deliveries are accounted for we are looking at fielding it.
- Principally it is the CRSM and Staff assistant accounting for deliveries, amongst BAU. Can we ask that Units remain patient while this takes place.
- The kit issue must be done as a whole and not partially to any Org/Unit there is no G4 mechanism in place and the only way to manage the roll out is to issue complete, this will stop any delta being left and people without kit.
- Dress Regulations These have had the final scrub from the multicultural networks and a final review with the tailor. The first RAMS Dress Committee will form up at the beginning of March
- Thanks to both SJC(UK) and 1UK XX (pictured) for offering to support the distribution of the kit.

The timeline with Team LEIDOS, our business partners, is out to 18 months before the G4 chain has been fully established, thank you in advance for your understanding through this transitional period.

At present a lot of items are on back order due to the amount of RAMS SP requiring the appropriate dress and accourrements.

The shop has been designed in such a way that a quarterly donation to the RAMS Charity will come in from the supplier from the sale of every item. It is also the only official site for accoutrements.

There are a number of sites on the internet who are selling RAMS Dress and Accoutrements. It is recommended that SP do not purchase items from unofficial sources as they are likely to fall below the standard expected for such items.

General Staff Dress

Confirmation of GS Dress order for RAMS Officers at OF5 and above:

If you were a GS Officer prior to the formation of the Royal Army Medical Service (RAMS) on 15 Nov 24, you will remain "Late" of your antecedent corps and will continue to wear GS Dress. This is regardless of whether you have specific Corps OF5+ dress or wear the Army's GS uniform. There will be no funding to change to RAMS GS, any changes will be at personal cost.

For those individuals who promote to OF5 after 15 Nov 24, the following dress direction applies:

Working Dress:

- RAMS Beret
- Victoria Green Backing to GS Capbadge.
- •GS TRF.
- •GS Stable Belt if personal choice is not to wear a non-issued belt.
- RAMS Rank Slide (preferred) or the standard issue.

No 1 Dress:

- •GS Buttons on Jacket and Cap.
- Dull Cherry Facing on Cap.
- GS Embroidered Capbadge on Navy Blue Backing.
- Dull Cherry Gorgets.
- Trousers Dull Cherry Stripe.
- Skirt -no change.
- No Croix de Guerre.

No 2 Dress:

- •GS Buttons on Jacket and No 1 Dress Cap.
- Dull Cherry Facing on No 1 Dress Cap.
- GS Embroidered Capbadge on Navy Blue Backing.
- Dull Cherry Gorgets.
- Trousers / Skirt No Change.
- No Croix de Guerre.

Mess Dress:

- GS Mess Dress jacket and waistcoat (if worn).
- Trouser Version: GS (red stripe) Trousers.
- No Croix de Guerre.
- In time there is the intention for a unique identifier and will be pursued by RHQ RAMS.

It will take up to 18 months for Leidos to provide all dress and accoutrements via the G4 chain, for now it is advised that anyone seeking RAMS GS Dress should contact Samuel Brothers Tailors only. In time, newly accredited tailors will be added to the RAMS Dress Regulations, this is to ensure that quality control is maintained at all times.

- The Charity's Governing Document is currently with the Legal SMEs.
- o The next stage will be to submit the document to the Charities Commission.
- o The Charity will be made up of sub committees.
- Serving Personnel (Reg & Res) and Veterans will be invited to participate and sit on these groups.

•Q1 25/26:

- Charity number allocated from the Charities Commission.
- o RAMS Charity back account established.
- o RAMS Charity launched.

Service Day's Pay Giving:

- Work on this continues.
- At the appropriate time all Serving Personnel (Regular) will receive information on how this will work going forward.
- Work has also commenced on how the RAMS Reserve Force could be invited into the scheme in the future.

In the meantime, the three antecedent Corps' Charities will continue to support all RAMS personnel, and their Veteran forces.

Benevolence Update from the Regimental Secretary

Benevolence Update

Continues to be managed, during the transition, by the antecedent Corps' Benevolence Committees.

We offer support to Serving, Retired (Veterans) Regular and Reserve, who are all eligible for financial assistance if they have completed one day's service and that their request fits and fulfils the Benevolence committee criteria. We do not take any cold cases nor direct requests . All cases are referred to us by our partner organisations TRBL (The Royal British Legion),OA (Officers' Association) and SSAFA via a Dimensions System incorporating COBSEO (Combined Service Charities).

Our Trained Benevolence Manager has sole access to this secure system and will set up cases and control the cases throughout the system including their appearance at the Corps' Committees.

In the last calendar year, the RAMC, RAVC, RADC, QARANC has seen approximately 320 cases in total and financially supported 280, the remainder did not fulfil the criteria.

The total amount of money granted in 2024 amounted to £200K.

Trends continue to show a rise in serving soldier cases. Each case is dealt with on a need and case by case basis and with equity of treatment.

Some of our recent cases involve a lack of funds and we expect to see this continue with the costof-living increases.
